

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## About Safe Helpline

Safe Helpline is operated by RAINN (Rape, Abuse & Incest National Network), the nation's largest anti-sexual violence organization, through a contract with the Department of Defense (DoD) Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Office (SAPRO). Safe Helpline provides anonymous, live, one-on-one specialized support, information, and resources to help empower sexual assault survivors in the DoD community as they take the next steps in their healing process.

Safe Helpline is made up of approximately 60 professionals from a variety of backgrounds who all share a passion to help people. They receive highly specialized training on topics including the neurobiology of trauma, working with survivors in the military, and the unique needs of male survivors. Safe Helpline staff provide crisis-intervention, support, and access to resources to the DoD community worldwide, 24/7—ensuring access to help, anytime, anywhere.

All Safe Helpline services are completely anonymous, confidential, and secure. Staff will never ask for personally identifying information, such as MSA or class year, during a chat or call. Additionally, per Military Rules of Evidence (MRE) 514- Victim-Victim Advocate Privilege, communications between a victim and Safe Helpline staff for the purpose of receiving advice, support, or assistance is privileged information in case arising under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.



## Safe Helpline Services

Safe Helpline has a number of anonymous services to help support sexual assault survivors in your community.



#### **Telephone Helpline**

Speak directly with a Safe Helpline staff member over the phone, 24/7, for confidential support, information, and resources by calling 877-995-5247.



#### **Online Helpline**

Access one-on-one, anonymous, and secure support from a Safe Helpline staff member through Safe Helpline's online chat portal at www.safehelpline.org/online.



#### Safe HelpRoom

Connect with and support other survivors of sexual assault through Safe Helpline's anonymous group chat service, in a moderated, secure online environment 24/7 at http://www.safehelproom.org/. Sessions just for men are also available every Sunday from 1300-1500 ET.



#### **Self-Paced Educational Programs**

Learn more about issues related to sexual assault, the services Safe Helpline offers, and how to support a friend or loved one with Safe Helpline's guided educational programs. All programs can be completed anonymously, and approved courses are available for D-SAACP credit.

## Training Opportunities

#### **Safe Helpline Presentations and Webinars**

The Safe Helpline team provides presentations and webinars to bases, installations and the MSAs to raise awareness of Safe Helpline services and discuss ways Sexual Assault Prevention and Response (SAPR) and Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention (SHARP) teams, commands, civilian sexual assault service providers, and others can leverage Safe Helpline when working with survivors of sexual assault.



## Training Opportunities

#### **Safe Helpline Self-Paced Educational Programs**

In addition to presentations and webinars, Safe Helpline offers five unique online programs, all roughly one hour in length, to help those looking for support or information related to sexual assault.

#### **How to Support a Survivor**

It may be useful for faculty and staff, as well as friends and family members of survivors, to complete Safe Helpline's How to Support a *Survivor* course. This program identifies helping behaviors that support survivors of sexual assault while also educating supporters about behaviors that can be harmful and how to avoid them.



#### **Building Hope and Resiliency**



Survivors on campus may find the Building Hope and Resiliency: Addressing the Effects of Sexual Assault program helpful in their healing process.

Recognizing the effect that trauma can have, this program is part of a comprehensive effort to enhance resiliency and improve readiness across the Total Force. Users will learn about sexual assault and its effects, assess their current coping skills, and find information about additional support and resources available. This program may be especially helpful for survivors that are not yet ready to talk to someone about what happened to them.


## Local Safe HelpRoom

#### **Host a Local Safe HelpRoom Session on Campus**

The Local Safe HelpRoom platform provides an online environment for survivors on campus to safely and anonymously receive online peer-to-peer support while removing common barriers to accessing in-person care, including time, cost, distance, and scheduling. Local Safe HelpRoom may be useful for survivors who may not be ready to reach out for in-person support or who may want to hear from other survivors on campus about how they are navigating their healing journey.



D-SAACP certified Sexual Assault Response Coordinators (SARCs) and Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Victim Advocates (SAPR VAs), or NACP certified Coast Guard SARCs and SAPR VAs, on campus can register to become a trained moderator on Safe Helpline's Local Safe HelpRoom platform and facilitate online peer-to-peer group chats for their communities.

## Safe Helpline App

The Safe Helpline app is a free mobile resource created to meet the unique needs of members of the DoD community affected by sexual assault. By downloading the app, survivors can access one-on-one crisis-intervention support through the Safe Helpline phone and online helplines 24/7. Additionally, survivors can search for resources that may help them address short- and long-term effects of sexual assault they may be experiencing. The App also provides practical tools to help survivors manage their self-care, including breathing and mindfulness exercises, and the ability to create a personalized self-care plan.

In Fiscal Year 2019, a higher proportion of young people ages 18-24 connected with Safe Helpline via the online chat than the Telephone Helpline. Online resources and mobile apps, such as the Safe Helpline app, are a great way to expand available resources to younger survivors and easily connect people to the support they deserve. For example, some MSAs have created their own mobile apps to reduce barriers to reporting and provide additional outlets for survivors of sexual assault to access support and resources (Annual Report on Sexual Harassment and Violence at the Military Service Academies: Academic Program Year 2018-2019, 17). In addition, when cadets and midshipmen travel outside the continental United States (OCONUS) for exchange programs, the Safe Helpline app can help them stay connected to the one-on-one helplines, peer-to-peer support through Safe HelpRoom, and access to self-care and relaxation exercises whenever they need it.
